



Rules and Expectations

(Behaviour Policy - Addendum)

In light of the new way the school will be running, we have developed an addition to the behaviour policy. This addendum will be reviewed with any ongoing changes to governmental advice and guidance.

Staff will continue to follow the existing behaviour policy with regards to positive behaviour reinforcement.

Low level behaviour will be dealt with within the phase 'bubble' where appropriate. For example, reflection time will be given within the classroom. If these become persistent, the adult in charge will speak to the parent or carer upon collection.

In addition to the behaviour policy, in order to keep the children safe, all children will be strongly encouraged to:

- **Keep a reasonable distance at all times;**
- **Wash hands at regular intervals throughout the day;**
- **Children are encouraged to not put any items in their mouths;**
- **Children can only use their own stationery, which is clearly labelled on their own desk and in their own tray;**
- **Children stay within their 'bubble' group, under direction from the teacher;**
- **Children stay within their 'bubble's' designated area during learning and playtimes.**

The above routines and procedures will be shared with children on a daily basis.

As always, child and staff safety will be the priority, so if some behaviours displayed by a child show disregard for the safety of that child, other children or staff members, the following procedure will take place:

- 1) The child will be asked to refrain from the dangerous behaviour. ie. running out of the classroom or touching other children, or taking items not assigned to them.
- 2) If they do not comply, a warning will be given and the children will be supported to restore their behaviour.
- 3) If they continue the behaviour, a member of SLT will be called for assistance using the phone (call the office in the first instance).
- 4) **If the anti-social Covid-19 behaviour continues, after additional adult intervention, parents/carers will be called to collect the child and, in discussion with the parents, next steps will be decided. This will be closely monitored and progress towards targets will be discussed with parents and carers in future meetings either by phone or face to face meetings.**
